We wanted to make you aware of a situation we have been dealing with in school this week. We have had some incredibly brave children who have been able to reach out and tell us that someone has been sending them explicit and inappropriate material to their instagram account. The parents of these children have been incredibly supportive and together we have worked with the police to try and put a stop to it.

Please can we ask you to take the time to check your child's device this weekend and ensure they have the maximum security setting in place. Should you need support with this the O2 shop in town will help you and they do not charge. You just need to take your device into the shop and ask them to check the settings.

We also want to make you aware of the name of the account that has been sending such inappropriate materials so that you can be vigilant when checking your child's device. Jak.a2018 is the name of the account and as far as we know it has only been targeting Instagram, however, this is not to say it is not targeting other social media.

If you do find that your child has also been a victim of this please don't hesitate to contact us in school for support or contact 101 to report it.
