BOOK FAIR

Lunchtime Supervisor Required

We require a Mid-day supervisor so if any parents are interested or know of someone who may be interested please call at the School office for an application form and further details.

Collecting children at the end of the day.

On the last newsletter we mentioned about parents leaving school by the door that they entered the School rather than leaving by the main front door. Most parents are following this request now and so the office staff are aware who is coming into the building, enabling them to safeguard our children.

Since we returned from the half term break the Early Years unit are now entering school via the gate in Escrick Street. The shed has been moved to the back of the playground and new fencing put in place to ensure our children are safe. This has had a positive effect within School as the hall is quieter and children are now quickly settling into the school day.

Again can we request that parents take note of the start and collection times for their child's class and please do not come into the hall until five minutes before this time. Once in the hall please control your children and stay as quiet as possible. This will avoid the disruption of teacher's preparation time and teaching but also prevent overcrowding in the hall.

Most parents do arrive on time to collect their child but please note that the end of the School day is 15:15 and your child should be collected at this time except in extreme circumstances.

Gamelan Music Sessions

A series of music workshops to introduce young people to the gamelan, which is a bronze percussion instrument from Indonisia and is played together as an ensemble. The workshops will be at York Music Centre three times each term, with sessions suitable for anyone aged 8-18. It will be a chance to play on genuine gamelan instruments and explore playing an interesting style of music in a group with others.
