Dear Parent/Carer,

This morning started with the children in Y1/2 excitedly following a trail of gold glitter, golden coins and balloons to some treasure that Mr Willy Wonka had left for them. It was lovely to see such high levels of enjoyment and enthusiasm and it really kick-started the learning for the day. Last week we wrote a 'Home Learning' policy which clearly lays out what will happen if individuals, small groups or bubbles have to self-isolate at home. I will send this out to you after I have shared it with the Governing Body next Monday.

Please could you leave the playground as soon as possible once you have your child/children and resist the temptation to have a chat with other parents, if you are waiting with your child for their sibling then please could you make sure that he/she stands next to you rather than playing with a friend. Finally, and this is the most important one as we are going to have an accident if we are not careful, please do not drive onto Escrick Street. It is very busy with pedestrians now as that is where you all wait to get on to the playground and cars going up and down add an unnecessary risk.
