Welcome Back!

Hello and welcome back! We hope you had a lovely break over the summer holiday.

We would like to give you a useful reminder of some school routines:

Reading Books, Planners and PE kit

Daily reading is very important because it develops not only higher level reading skills, but also has a huge impact on writing. We have opportunities to read every day in school and pupils should be reading at home. If your child is a fluent reader they may well be reading independently. **Please still talk to your child about their reading** as this helps develops a deeper understanding.

Please ensure your child brings their planner and reading book to school every day and reads regularly at home.

Please also ensure the planner is read and signed weekly.

It lets you know what your child is up to during the week, including homework arrangements and spellings to be learnt. We also write comments in every planner.

<u>P.E. Kit:</u> Children should have a white t-shirt, navy/ black shorts and outdoor trainers/ plimsolls. They should have a sweatshirt and track-suit bottoms for when the weather gets colder.

(Children who wear earrings must have tape to cover them or be able to take them out themselves.)

Mornings and Home Time

Please ensure that your child is in the playground at 8:40am ready for when the whistle blows. This helps children to be ready and settled to start the day at 8.45. It also disrupts the rest of the children when others arrive late.

If you would like to speak to a member of staff (please do!) it is often easier at the end of the school day as mornings can be very busy times.
