Auditory memory game:

Digit repetition: Say a series of unrelated digits to

your child (start with 2 digits e.g. 3 8) Your child has to repeat them in the correct order. The length of the list can be gradually increased e.g. 4 6 1 5 7). Remember to say them slowly, 1 digit per second is probably best.

Visual perception activities:



Who lives here? Make a set of pictures of people (these may be cut from magazines) and a set of houses in

different colours, or different appearance in some way.

The people are matched with the houses and then jumbled up. The child has to rearrange them in the correct relationship. If you progress to giving the people names, the task develops visual and verbal skills.


