


This is a court in Manchester called The Justice centre.

Gingerbread house

Hansel and Gretel is a well-loved tale of two children who get lost in the woods and come to an evil witch's gingerbread house. In this article, we'll show you a recipe for a gingerbread house that's delicious-though not suitable for use as a residence!

You will need

- *650g plain flour
- *1/2 tspn baking powder
- *1 tspn ground nutmeg
- *200g caster sugar
- *1 tspn ground ginger
- *1/2 teaspoon salt
- *1 tspn ground cinnamon
- *225g butter, cubed
- *250ml honey

- Preheat oven to 180 C / Gas 4. Prepare several baking trays by lining with baking parchment.
- In a small bowl sift together the flour, salt, baking powder, cinnamon, nutmeg and ginger; set aside.
- In another large bowl cream butter with sugar; add honey and mix until smooth, then add sifted flour mixture and knead quickly until you have a ball of dough. Wrap in cling film and chill in the fridge for about 1 hour, or up to overnight. Roll out dough to a thickness of 3-5mm. Cut out house parts according to template.
- Bake on prepared baking trays for about 15 minutes. Take biscuits out of oven and let cool completely on a wire rack.

Icing:

1. Meanwhile, prepare icing by combining icing sugar, water and lemon juice in a small bowl. Construct the walls and roof of the house by following the instructions in our article on building a gingerbread house (if the glaze is too runny add icing sugar, if too thick add a little water).

1. Let house set and harden for at least 4 to 5 hours (but ideally overnight), then decorate with sweets, chocolate, icing sugar or marzipan.

How to survive a wolf attack
