Wednesdays

On a Wednesday morning before the start of the school day we have our Early Years team meetings. Occasionally these may over run slightly and it may be a little later than 8:30am that the door opens. Please bear with us, thank you.

Every week on Wednesday mornings we go to our Forest School (located on the school's back field). Please can your children come ready in their waterproofs and welly boots, we go out whatever the weather!

Wednesday afternoons is PE and music. PE kit should contain: *Plain t-shirt (white, navy, red), *Shorts/leggings/jogging pants (white, navy, black, red), *White socks, *Plimsolls/trainers.

PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE REMEMBER TO LABEL ALL CLOTHING AND BELONGINGS.

<u>Safequarding</u>

Our ultimate aim is to safeguard and keep our children in Early Years protected at all times. Only DBS checked staff and volunteers can be left alone with children. All visitors and placement students are supervised at all times. We let the children attend the bathroom on their own to promote their independence and confidence. As part of our continued policy updates we are asking that any parents/carers taking children to the toilet could stand outside of the bathroom and respect the privacy of all other children. Please speak to any of the Early Years staff if you have any queries or questions regarding this.

In school we continually talk about making sure that children know to go into a toilet cubicle alone, and keeping the area covered by their pants/knickers private to themselves.

Learning from home

We love to hear about all the fantastic things that your child does out of school. We have some Golden Moments sheets for you to document special moments, please help yourself to fill out and return to the Learning from home box in the large classroom.

Rewards.

We are continually trying hard to reinforce good behaviour in the Early years unit and reward them generously! You may have heard your children talking about Dojos....well these are points that each of the children receive for following our good behaviour rules; being kind, sharing, good work etc. When a child reaches 10 points and every 10 more after, they get to have a dip in the treat box! We also have Head teacher's Awards, a child will receive one of these for exceptional work or behaviour. Our Head teacher's celebrations are every Friday afternoon at 2:45pm.

Carecent charity day.

This Friday - 21st September - is non uniform day. Carecent is the local homeless charity that we have supported for the last 5 years. The children are invited to come in non uniform, dressed as anything beginning with the letter C! In return we ask that you bring in donations for the charity on the day and leave them in the lower hall. These can be: non perishable food, adult clothing or toiletries. Thank you.

Things you may need to know!

- PLEASE, PLEASE label all of your child's clothing including all footwear first name and surname and keep checking that it hasn't faded after washing. All items of unnamed clothing will go into the early years lost property basket and then transferred to the KS1 lost property box every Monday which is situated in the lower hall.
- Please do not let your children bring their own toys/comforters into school. It is causing a lot of distress for them and others when they go missing or another child takes it.
- Your child does not require to bring in their own snack from home, we provide a healthy snack and a drink of milk for each child, every day.
- If your child is absent from school it is mandatory for parents to phone the school's absence line, leave a message stating your child's class and the reason for their absence. If your child is vomiting or has diarrhoea then your child will need to stay away from school for 48hrs from the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea as per our school sickness policy.
- We are a **NUT FREE** school. This is due to some pupils in school having nut allergies. Direct or indirect exposure to nuts can cause an acute sometimes life threatening allergic reaction. As such we remind you that nut products are not to be brought into school. This includes items brought in for packed lunches, snacks or treats. Please be vigilant as many brunch/chocolate bars contain peanuts, hazelnuts and almonds. Thank you very much in advance for your cooperation.
- We know that some parents are new to 'school life' and the general routine. If there is anything you ever need to know or you have any questions/queries please do speak to a member of the Early Years Team or Helen/Emma in the school office.
- Please always remember to send your child with a coat, our English weather is so unpredictable and we will go out in all weathers to play.
