Yr3/4 – Hockey 12, Tag golf 10, Tennis 4 children. Catching a total of 114 children giving experience of team participation.  All 45 Year2 children had training and then all took part in South Yorks Partnership skipping event at Fulford School.  Staff training given by PE Co-ordinator in Team teaching with Gymnastics with observations and feedback given.  Deliver PE through intervention groups.

School council involved to name new teams.</p> <p>Sports Days involved 180 children.</p> <p>Within inter-School competition the School achieved great success winning the York cluster finals in gymnastics. The Fishergate team then represented the area of York within the North Yorkshire Youth Games. The netball team and athletics teams also won their cluster events before losing out in the city finals.</p> <p>Yr5/6 football team competed in York School's football league involving 14 of our Yr5/6 children. Audits used to plan extra curricular timetables in conjunction with partnership competitions.</p> <p>We have increased the opportunities for children by staffing clubs and subsidising the pupil premium club places.</p> <p>This was found difficult due to various reasons – pick up arrangements, lack of choice and resistance of traditional games. Will try to develop family clubs with games and team building exercises.</p> <p>Club provision within school ensured every child in school could attend a club every night of the week. 31 clubs were attended by 76% of pupils (approximately 137 pupils)</p> <p>34 pupil premium children attended a variety of 8 clubs designed to cater for the inclusion of a range of disabilities.</p>
