To support staff in meeting requirements of new National Curriculum. 	<p>Fishergate continues to enter most of the competitions organised by YSSN including the following: Yr 5/6 - Tag rugby 14, Cricket 18, Swimming 8, Tennis 8, Sports Hall athletics 16, Netball 16 and Football league 14 children. Yr3/4 – Hockey 12, Tag golf 10, Tennis 4 children. Catching a total of 120 children giving experience of team participation.</p> <p>Intra-school house competitions took place during the Autumn (Tag Rugby/Netball), Spring (Football/Hockey) and Summer (Rounders/Basketball) terms.</p> <p>Analysis of staff audits led to the delivery of Cricket CPD in Summer 2019.</p> <p>Staff training given by PE Co-ordinator in Team teaching with Gymnastics with observations and feedback given.</p> <p>Progression of skills documents was developed to ensure staff had a clear idea of the previous learning which had taken place and what skills children were expected to achieve before leaving their phase.</p>

As this was the fifth year in a row that Fishergate Primary School had achieved the Gold Mark from Sainsburys Games, we were able to apply for and achieve the Platinum award. This meant Fishergate were one of only four schools within the City of York to have ever achieved the Platinum Award.</p> <p>Due to increased numbers in School the house competition increased from 4 to 6 teams. School council involved to name new teams.</p> <p>Sports Days involved 270 children.</p> <p>Fishergate attended every partnership competition for Upper KS2 and Lower KS2. Year 6 pupil, Daniel Campbell, achieved a great success, winning the Cross Country athletics event, whilst the netball team won their cluster finals and went on to represent Fishergate School in the city finals.</p> <p>Yr5/6 football team competed in York School's football league involving 14 of our Yr5/6 children. We will aim to increase this number in future.</p>

We are still trying to develop family clubs with games and team building exercises.</p> <p>Club provision within school ensured every child in school could attend a club every night of the week. 32 clubs were attended by 78% of pupils.</p> <p>38 pupil premium children attended a variety of 8 clubs designed to cater for the inclusion of a range of disabilities.</p>
