Sport Premium Funding Review and Analysis 2020/21

In 2013/14, the Government launched its Sports Premium funding initiative in order to help schools improve their PE and increase the sporting opportunities they offer pupils. This money is allocated to schools as a lump sum and an additional £5 per pupil. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, with the aim of increasing participation levels, improving the quality of provision and providing opportunities for competition.

At Fishergate Primary School, our vision is to raise the aspirations of all pupils regardless of athletic talent, physical and mental abilities or disabilities and encouraging them to acquire motor skills to perform a variety of physical activities in order to pursue a healthy and active lifestyle. We believe physical education is an essential part of a child's educational development and that it will also provide the children with the necessary skills of good sportsmanship, to strive for excellence and not to be discouraged if they do not win; equipping them with the appropriate responses in order to deal with winning or losing, thus facilitating valuable lessons for their future.

At the start of the academic year in September 2020, an action plan was developed to set out the objectives for the forthcoming year. However, this was devised with the realisation that objectives may be severely disrupted due to continuous lockdowns due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The key aims of this action plan were to:-

- 1) To promote the quality and provision of the PE curriculum by increasing availability and access to PE equipment and improved facilities during the COVID-19 pandemic.**
- 2) To promote the quality and provision of the PE curriculum by increasing knowledge and expertise of staff, with a particular focus on support staff.**
- 3) To provide pupils with opportunities for competition at all levels through both inter-school and intra-school competition and to raise activity levels in school.**
- 4) To increase opportunities for participation within extra-curricular clubs.**

The following document aims to assess the success and impact of these objectives, and outline the next steps for the development of PE at Fishergate Primary School.

The level of funding for Fishergate Primary School for 2020/21 was £18,590.

The money was used to support the following initiatives.
