Overview	In 2013/14, the Government launched its Sports Premium funding initiative in order to help schools improve their PE and increase the sporting opportunities they offer pupils. This money is allocated to schools as a lump sum and an additional £10 per pupil. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, with the aim of increasing participation levels, improving the quality of provision and providing opportunities for competition. The following document aims to assess the success and impact of these objectives, and outline the next steps for the development of PE at Fishergate Primary School.

How we plan to make sure these improvements are sustainable	 Total Sports subscription and planning provides specialist coaching for our teaching and teaching assistants. This will ensure how quality P.E. teaching and learning in the years to come. Total Sports after school clubs provides specialist coaching for the children, giving many the confidence to join clubs outside of school. Investing in new P.E and play equipment ensures that quality of provision remains high. Less active pupils are encouraged and taught strategies to access physical exercise and understand why good physical health is important. This raises their potential to be fit and healthy adults.
Impact of the Sports Funding 2022/2023	 Yr 1/2, 3/4 and 5/6 PE leaders were trained to use PE equipment, including setting out equipment before and after playtimes, to organise games and develop basic coaching skills. Creation of School Sports council and recruitment of Year 5 members. Pupil voice questionnaires were completed and play leader timetable developed and suitable equipment purchased. Replacement of storage units was completed. Equipment audit completed and replacements bought for damages. Autumn and Spring House competitions were delivered throughout school for Football/Hockey (autumn) and Tag Rugby/Netball (spring). Fishergate School attended all Partnership competitions which were available. Two-year long term plan was completed to link with both competitions and delivery by teachers and PE specialist. This coverage allowed main sports to be covered each year, whilst allowing opportunities to experience a wider range of sports at other times. Children completed audits at the start of the year to outline clubs they would like to attend within school these audits were then used to plan extra-curricular timetables throughout the year, in conjunction with partnership competitions and seasonal availability.
