PHASE UPDATES

EYU - This week we have been reading Goldilocks and the Three Bears, we have acted out the story and written our own story books.

In Maths, we have been learning about 3D shapes and doing shape walks around the school. Year 1/2 -We've been learning about the artists Matisse and Frida Kahlo and linking it to punctuating sentences in English whilst in Maths Year 2 have been looking at unit and non unit fractions. In Science, we've been making plants with play doh and labelling parts of plants, whilst in Topic we've been creating Starry Night pictures using paints and water colours.

Year 3/4 - It was fantastic to see so many 45 parents/carers working alongside their children in the writing workshops this week, the children really enjoyed working alongside their parents.

We have started our new topic – Rivers, and have a trip to the Foss Barrier next week.

Y5/6 - As well as working really hard in their booster groups, 5/6 have begun learning new vocabulary in French which they will use to run their own cafe later in the term.

ONLINE SAFETY

This is what we are covering in KS2 assemblies this half term:

What are the SMART rules for staying safe online?

S for Safe: Keep personal details away from strangers.

M for Meet: Don't meet people that you know online unless you're with a trusted adult.

A for Accept: Don't click any links that you're unsure about.

R for Reliable: Don't believe everything people tell you. Always check trusted sources to find the truth.

T is for Tell: If you see something online that upsets you, tell a trusted adult straight away.

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
