EYU – It was great to speak to so many of our parents and carers this week during parents evenings and to share all the lovely work your children have been doing. We have had a great week reading 'Brown Bear' and writing our own sentences about what we can see. In maths, we have been finding number bonds to 10. We had a great time in the forest looking for flowers fairies and finding more signs of spring.

Year 1/2 – we are still loving our learning about dinosaurs and have also been learning more about other animals and their habitats.

Year 3/4 - have been learning about persuasive language. We have also linked this to our science, looking at the effects of Climate Change on the polar bear which is what our class novel is based on. We are really pleased to be able to connect with these children and will share more about what we have found out in refugee week in June.
