Have a great weekend – hopefully in some sunshine!

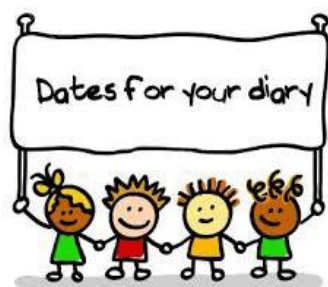
