BODHI NEWS

Our PAWs trainer, Rachel, worked with Tina, Dani and Lisa on Wednesday morning and we learnt a huge amount. Her main mission was to check that Bodhi was getting everything that he needed and we were delighted that she could see how happy and confident he is in our school. She also wanted to know what our goals were and will be working with us to achieve them in the next academic year. The main ones are that he can work with small groups of children for various reasons, that he can support children who need a bit of 1:1 if they are anxious or having a tough time, that he is there to say hello to everyone on the playground at pick off and drop off and is happy for strokes, and that he can chill in a classroom for the afternoon while his human (Tina) is teaching the children in it. Rachel thought that all of those things (and more) were highly achievable.

She did say that we needed to reduce the amount of physical interactions with humans – of both the adult and child variety – while he is still so young. So, we will be telling the children that when he is out and about in the halls or on the playground that they can give him a wave but not to come over and ask if they can stroke him. It would really help Bodhi out if all you grown-ups could follow this rule as well. I know it is frustrating as he is so very cute, but it won't be forever.

She then did a training session on loose lead walking which is going to need a lot of work from the humans never mind Bodhi!
