

Pre-loved uniforms on Monday



Year 1/2 This week, Year 1 have been innovating their own 'Poles Apart' stories, which they learnt last week. Meanwhile Year 2 have continued learning about the Inuits, looking at Inuit clothing and igloos. In RE, Mrs Burt and Mrs Murray have been learning about Islam and how to wear a hijab.
