Happy New Year to you all, I hope that you all had a happy and restful break. As always, it has been fabulous to welcome you all back to school this week.

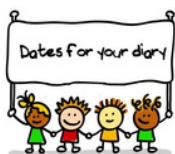

Bodhi Corner

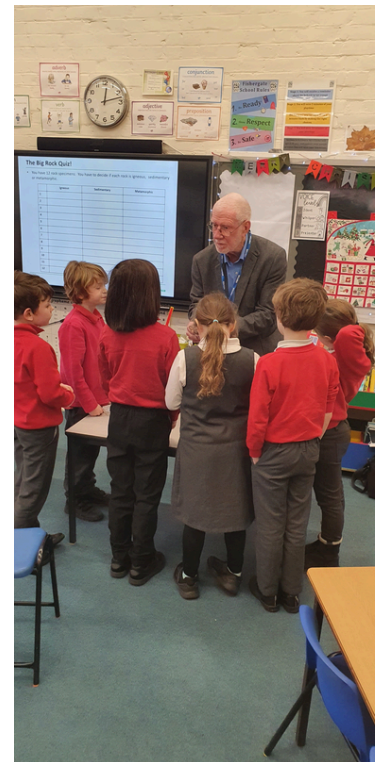
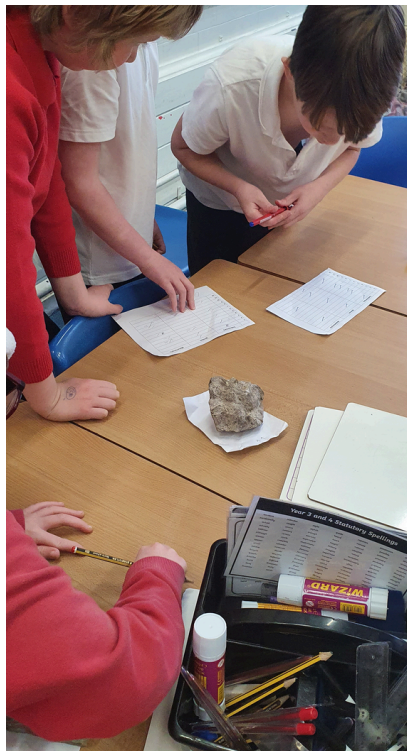
